This **Privacy Notice for California Partners/Staff and Applicants for Employment** (“**CA Employee Privacy Notice**”) supplements the information contained in the Privacy Policy of Bridgeway Capital Management, Inc. (“**Bridgeway**”) <https://www.bridgeway.com/wp-content/uploads/BCM-Privacy-Procedures-20200731.pdf> (the “**Privacy Policy**”) and only applies to Partners/staff members and applicants’ service of Bridgeway who are residents of California (collectively, “Associates”).

This CA Partners Privacy Notice explains how Bridgeway collects, uses and discloses personal information relating to Associates who are subject to the California Consumer Privacy Act of 2018 (“**CCPA**”).

**What is Personal Information?**

Under the CCPA, “Personal Information” means information that relates to, describes, references, is reasonably capable of being associated with, or could reasonably be linked, directly or indirectly, with a particular consumer or household. Personal Information does not include de-identified or aggregated information.

**Information We Collect**

We may collect Personal Information from you in a variety of different situations, including, but not limited to on our Website, through your mobile device, through e-mail, in our physical office locations, through the mail, and/or over the phone. We may also collect Personal Information from you in the ways described in our Privacy Policy <https://www.bridgeway.com/wp-content/uploads/BCM-Privacy-Procedures-20200731.pdf>.

**We do not sell your Personal Information to anyone.** Within the last 12 months, the Personal Information we have obtained on Associates include the items listed in the chart below.
