

The Fund uses an option writing strategy in which the Fund may sell covered calls or secured put options. Up to 75% of Fund assets may be invested in options. Options are subject to special risks and may not fully protect the Fund against declines in the value of its stocks. In addition, an option writing strategy limits the upside profit potential normally associated with stocks. Finally, the Fund's fixed-income holdings are subject to three types of risk. Interest rate risk is the chance that bond prices overall will decline as interest rates rise. Credit risk is the chance a bond issuer will fail to pay interest and principal. Prepayment risk is the chance a mortgagebacked bond issuer will repay a higher yielding bond, resulting in a lower paying yield. The Fund's Investments in stock index futures are subject to the risk that the returns of the basket of stocks to which they are hedged are reduced by the losses on the futures in a rising market. Investments in foreign securities can be more volatile than investments in U.S. securities. Foreign securities can be adversely affected by political, economic and market developments abroad.

The S&P 500 Index is a broad-based, unmanaged measurement of changes in stock market conditions based on the average of 500 widely held common stocks. Price-to-earnings ratios, price-to-book ratios, and price-to-cash flow ratios all express the value of a stock's most recent closing price as divided by the underlying company's earnings per share, book value per share, or cash flow per share (respectively), all as computed over the previous 12 months. **Price/Cash Flow ratio** is a measure of the market's expectations of a firm's future financial health. Because this measure deals with cash flow, the effects of depreciation and other non-cash factors are removed. Similar to the price/earnings ratio, this measure provides an indication of relative value. **Beta** is a quantitative measure of the volatility of the fund relative to the S&P 500 over the past three years. A beta above one is more volatile than the overall market, while a beta below one is less volatile.
